

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the DART?

The DART is a semistructured psychodiagnostic interview for assessing mental disorders based on DSM-5 criteria which is suitable for use in both research and clinical settings. The DART consists of several different components, each serving a different purpose at each step of the assessment process. The DART is modular in nature such that users can select disorder-specific sections relevant to their population of interest. Additionally, we also developed a self-report questionnaire which functions as a screening tool to identify relevant DART modules to administer.

Does the DART cost anything to use?

What populations is the DART intended for?

Presently, the DART is intended for use with an adult population (i.e., 18 years of age and above) and can be used in clinical or research settings.

What format is the DART available in?

The DART is presently available in English. Additionally, the DART is available in PDF format, meaning there is no electronic version available at this time.

Who can administer the DART?

Similar to other diagnostic interviews, the DART is intended to be used by interviewers who are familiar with psychopathology, the DSM, and diagnostic assessment.

Is there training provided for the DART?

We are in the process of developing training materials and will release an update when more is known.
